



Adjunct Instructors Needed

Lawson State Community College is looking adjunct (part-time) instructors in the following areas: mathematics, English, speech, drama/theater, reading, history, chemistry, biology, psychology, sociology, and physics. Adjuncts with flexible hours - day, evening, and weekend- are desired. The minimum qualifications for transfer program instructors include a master degree in the teaching field or a master degree with a minimum of eighteen graduate hours in the teaching field. Additionally, adjunct instructors are needed in the Career Technical education division in the following areas: commercial drivers' license (CDL), automotive sales, interior design, fashion design, electrical, plumbing, carpentry, CNC and machine tool technology, automotive technician. The minimum qualifications for career technical program instructors include but not limited to an associate degree, certification in the specialty area, and/or licensure.
